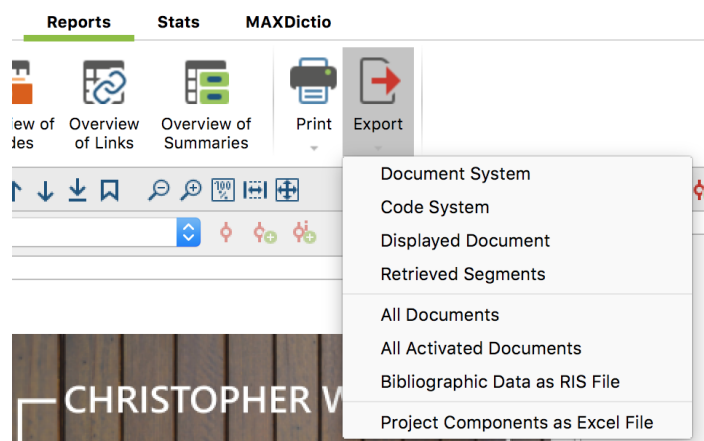


# Spotlight Session: Report and Export Tools

## Versatile

MAXQDA has several available options for your export requirements and a fully comprehensive reporting tool. Let's start with the Reports>Export tools.



The purpose of the above is to deliver your MAXQDA information in an alternative format such as RIS, excel, word processor or HTML (with associated data depending on the chosen option). Please select 'Project Components as Excel File':

Use this function to gain a general overview of your project at a glance

Let's now try the 'retrieved segments' export. Let's select the necessary options (based on your requirements) and compare the differences between export types.

First the RTF:

You get a summary for various pieces of information such as the parent code, the weight, the name of the respondent/document, position of the retrieved text and the actual information attached to that code.

Below is the XLS/X:

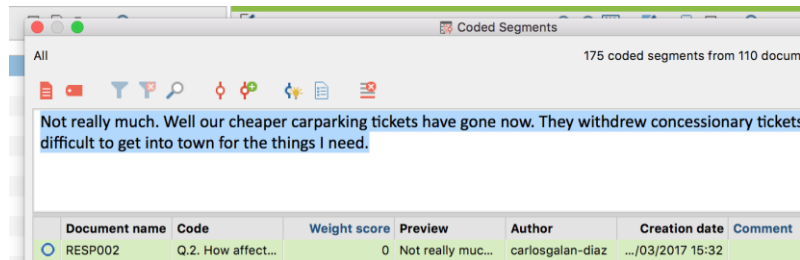

The 'documents' options will export the actual file in RTF for texts, XLS/X for tables, PDF for PDF files and original image formats for images.

Another very neat feature of MAXQDA is that you can select segments, text or objects in MAXQDA with **Ctrl** or **cmd** and a mouse click and then select an export variant or copy it with **Ctrl+C** or **cmd+C** to the clipboard. Lets try the cmd+C in the overview of coded segments (Reports > ribbon):



If we highlight and use cmd+C (see left), then paste onto Word we get the following:

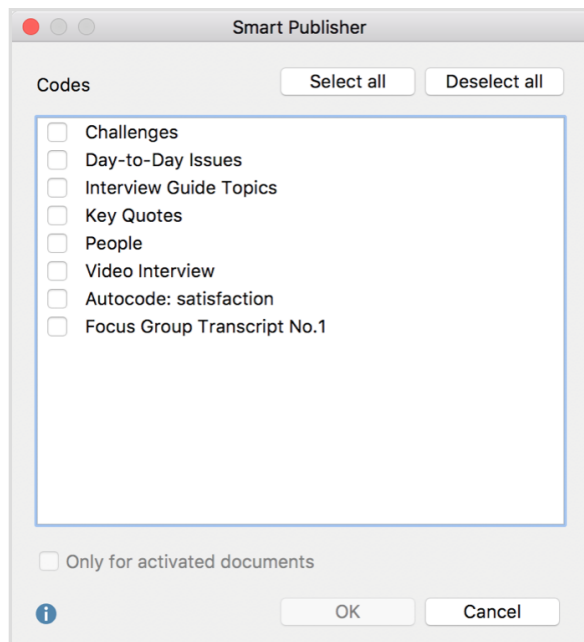

If we however select 'RESP002', cmd+C, then paste, we get the following, see left. You could select as many documents and there would be as many rows in the example table.

Comprehensive



MAXQDA includes Smart Publisher, it's report generator. Smart Publisher allows you to export selected retrieved segments in a formatted Word document report, including title page and table of contents. The structure of the report is determined by the "Code System":

- An individual chapter will be created for each top-level code.
- A subchapter will be created for each subcode.
- Coded Segments of each code form the content of each (sub)chapter.



"Export Codebook" function allows you to automatically generate a Codebook. The codebook lists all or selected codes in the order of the Code System and also outputs the associated code memo for each code. The completed Codebook therefore contains the category definition of each individual code, ***provided that this was recorded in the code memo***. This saves a lot of work in the creation of the annex for a research report, especially since it provides the opportunity to unify the font for all memo text.

Summaries: create your compiled summaries together, with or without coded segments in a table overview.

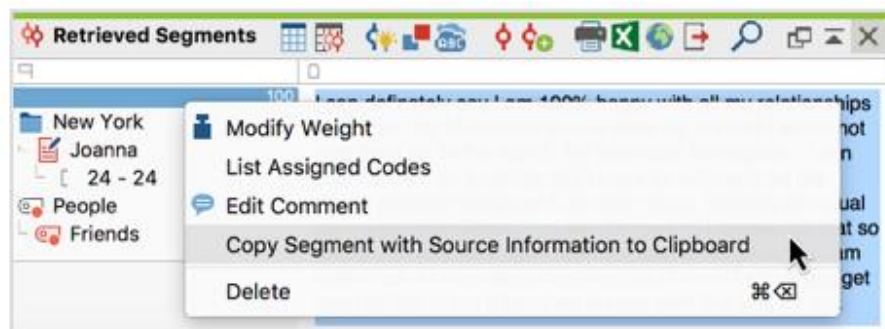

Copy segment with source information on clipboard is probably one of the all time favourites. In a research project, citations (such as interview passages) are needed for writing up the findings. In order to keep everything together (source information such as document and paragraph they come from) you can do a **Copy segment with source information to Clipboard** by right-clicking on the source information in the "Retrieved segments" window.



MAXQDA copies the selected segment into the clipboard. Now you can paste the citation into your word processing program by pressing **Ctrl+V** (Windows) or **cmd+V** (Mac). At the end of the citation, the document name from the "Document System," as well as the paragraph, will automatically be inserted. For example:

#### **Health:**

*I am pretty satisfied with my health because I have never been severely ill and I have never broken a bone in my life. What bothers me about my health is my allergies and my asthma. I have terrible allergies and it is rare for me to be able to breath through my nose with ease. My doctor also keeps on prescribing the same medicine and it doesn't see to be working. I will definitely see an allergist this summer. (Indiana\Kelly: 6 - 7)*

**Tip:** The function can also be opened by right-clicking on a coding stripe or by right-clicking on a row in the "Overview of Retrieved Segments".
