

### Reports with MAXQDA

- MAXQDA's report and export functions come in handy when for example
  working in a team or when you need to report your results at the end of your
  research. Obviously, when publishing your paper or report, the data that you
  have to provide should make it easy to understand your research process.
- First, be transparent about the heart and soul of your research: the codes. Let MAXQDA easily create a codebook based on the code memos that you have created during the coding process. This way, every reader can understand how you defined the codes and how you understood them during your research. Go to: Reports > Codebook





### **Exports with MAXQDA**

- Second, reporting your findings means reporting your coded segments. Supervisors, journal reviewers and others would like to see what you have coded and where. There are several options to do so:
  - First, you can export the coded segments for each document individually by clicking with a right-click on the document and select the overview for the coded segments. The same applies for document groups.
  - Second, you can export the codes segments displayed in the retrieved segments window. Here, you can export it to Excel, Word or as a HTMLfile
  - o Third, you can export your summaries either individually or using the export button in the Reports-ribbon.
  - Fourth, and this might be the easiest way to create one single file for your supervisor for example, using the option "Project Components as Excel file". MAXQDA creates one Excel-file, containing every single information in the project file.







## Data Archiving

• Another new feature is the option of archiving. Click on "Archive Data" in the Home ribbon. You can select and deselect components of your project that should be stored or not:



• MAXQDA creates one single folder containing the documents, media and meta data as well as the statistical data. It does NOT contain the coded segments.
